

## One More Step Along the Way

Although a month of the new year has already passed, this is the first edition of KNEC News for the new year so I wish everybody a Happy New Year. Thank the Lord that we can leave 2016 behind and, with no major alarms in January, enter the calmer waters of 2017.

From the middle of September 2016 onwards, when Rev Groenewald told us he was leaving, into December, there seemed to be a never-ending list of items to be attended to. We should all thank God that he had chosen servants who were enabled to put in an extra effort to ensure that during this period everything that was planned to happen in our congregational life actually did happen. Further, all the reins that André had to let go were picked up. So far there has been nothing found in a black hole! What was a little fraught at times was ensuring cover for Sunday worship. As had been planned for quite some time Brenda was on holiday during October and half of November and, with so many other vacant charges in West Lothian, finding a minister available on a Sunday was difficult. However, Ken Mackay and David Black rescued us. Thank you gentlemen.

Then December arrived and, suddenly, all the planning and discussion regarding a locum minister came to fruition and slotted neatly into place. Phyllis Thomson helped out by running the Annual Scout Service and that was much appreciated given everything else that was going on.

What about the search for a new minister? After André's induction to Balerno on 25<sup>th</sup> October, we were free to start the search for a new minister and Session actually moved quite swiftly. During November, some groundwork was laid. At the end of November, Session made a pre-requisite decision and also tasked a small team from Session with producing a Parish Profile. I pray that the Parish Profile will be finally approved by Session very early in February. In parallel, plans are in place to elect a Nominating Committee on 12<sup>th</sup> February. That means that the real work of searching for a new minister can start in earnest during February.

For those not on the Committee, sit back, don't worry, put your trust in God and enjoy normal congregational life in the locally calm waters of 2017.

The Kosy Kaff is a drop in cafe for children of primary school age run and funded by Kirknewton and East Calder Parish Church. Volunteers provide FREE hot chocolate and home baking for the children who attend as well as a safe place for them to play board games together and enjoy craft activities.



The Kosy Kaff is very well attended by local children and we normally attract between twenty and forty children. We rejoice in God's provision of sufficient numbers of dedicated helpers thus far, without whom the cafe would cease to exist! Half of our volunteers come from within the church and half from the village. Volunteers do not specifically discuss Jesus with the children but all the children know that it is church funded and we do have opportunities to answer faith questions. We also give small gifts to the children at Easter and Christmas time and talk about the real meanings of these festivities which bring important outreach opportunities. Child protection is very important to us and this year we have made a point of ensuring everyone who volunteers has been on a safeguarding course as well as being a member of the PVG scheme.

Our ongoing struggles are staffing levels, child protection and space this year all of which are manageable at present.

The main issue this year I think has been space! We meet in the village hall and it can be pretty squashed when we're reaching 50 kids. It would be nice for the children to have some space to play a few ball games too.

Valentines' Day reminds us of the importance of expressing our love to those close to us. But how can we go beyond simply flowers and a card? Jesus says: 'A new command I give you: Love one another. As I have loved you, so you must love one another' (John 13:34). How can we express love in our everyday relationships like Jesus?

#### Listening

We need to listen to others, just as Jesus did. He asked questions of people and waited for them to process their answer. How well do we listen to others? When with somebody, do we find ourselves already thinking of what we want to say before they've finished speaking. Listening takes time; you can't rush it!

#### Touching

Jesus reached out to touch the untouchables in his world, including lepers, the sick and children. One survey has suggested that we all need at least 8-10 meaningful touches a day to maintain emotional health! A warm handshake, touch on the arm or hug can be of real value. Of course, it should be appropriate touch - helpful for the other person not just for ourselves.

#### Speaking

Jesus' conversation was always full of grace and truth (John 1:14). Do we speak words of grace, by offering comfort, giving encouragement or expressing care and

concern? However, we should also be ready to speak words of truth, in asking for forgiveness, seeking reconciliation or addressing conflict.

Where is the challenge for us in expressing love this Valentine's Day?

This year the Boys did all the speeches, toasts, serving the meals as well as presenting the Trophy and we thank them for their contribution. Maybe next year they'll do the cooking (perhaps not!!!)



On 15th January, our locum, Rev. Ken McKay preached on the subject of 'gates': gates that keep us in; gates that keep us out; gates that protect us and keep us safe; gates that clang shut on freedom; gates flung open to release grateful captives. Like those heartrending old films of the concentration camps being liberated at the end of the Second World War.

Ken spoke of the poem\* beginning *'I said to the man who stood at the gate of the year'*. George VI used it in his famous speech to the British Empire at the beginning of 1939. The poem continues:

*'Go out into the darkness and put your hand into the Hand of God. That shall be to you better than light and safer than a known way.* 

That was destined to be a year etched on the world's memory, synonymous with the seven years of war that lay ahead. The King's speech was chillingly prophetic. The gate of that year was opening upon some of the deepest and most dreadful darkness in human history. Known ways were about to be lost forever. Only reaching out to God in trust and dependency would help; *His* ways do not change and will never be lost. The week before, Brenda had talked about singing to God even in the most difficult times of life. In the Bible, Paul and Simon were beaten and imprisoned but still they sang. Sometimes the worst circumstances produce the most powerful music. We think of protest songs like *'Blowin' in the Wind'* and *'Where Have All the Flowers Gone?'* We think of slaves singing their wonderful spirituals whilst toiling in the cotton fields, oppressed and abused, with no sign of release.

Putting these two sermons together, we can treat our barriers and burdens as gates that we must find a way to open. By doggedly singing the praises of God (in our hearts if not aloud!) when we are faced with closed and menacing gates – or maybe with ones that are so enormous we don't think we can push/pull them open – we can find a way through. Like the 1939 King, we can choose to reach out in trust to God, singing as we go.
