



# East Calder Gala Day

## Saturday 10<sup>th</sup> June

Gala day is almost upon us and being one of KNEC's main outreach events in the village, we would like to make it really count. Therefore, the Social & Community Committee requires your help to make it a memorable day.

### *How can you help?*

1. We need volunteers to help make up the rolls at 8.30am in the Church Hall and a team to man the tea tent (even if you can only manage for 1hour) between 12.30pm and 4.00pm.
2. Donations of home baking, or a contribution of money towards the cost of provisions, would be greatly appreciated. It would be helpful if baking is brought along to the Church Hall between 7.00 and 8.00pm on Friday night (9<sup>th</sup> June), between 8.00 and 10.30am on Saturday morning or directly to the Tea Tent between 11.30 & 12.30 on Gala Day.
3. Tea Tent. We also require volunteers for putting up the tea tent and taking it down! **Any help would be greatly appreciated, especially taking it down! – 9.30am to put up the tent and 4.00pm to take it down.**



*We would like to really appeal for lots of baking again this year as it is always popular and quickly runs out. Last year was amazing and people were in awe at the display of cakes so please help if you can!*

**\*What do we need?** – scones, pancakes, tea loaves, traybakes, sponges, cupcakes, tarts – anything would be great!!

# **PVG (Protecting Vulnerable Groups) Registration and Safeguarding Training**

Some people have asked me about PVG Registration and Safeguarding Training and whether or not they need to do both.

## ***PVG Registration***

Anyone who is going to work with children or vulnerable adults within the church needs to be PVG registered. The registration will be either for working with children, with vulnerable adults or both. I would issue an application form for completion and this is returned to me with two forms of identification. One of these needs to be photographic evidence (passport, driving licence, bus pass etc.). The other needs to be a utility bill, bank statement or a document with the person's address. As well as the application form, a self-declaration form requires to be completed. I do not see this form and it should be put into the brown envelope which comes with the application pack, signed and then returned to me. Some people may be PVG registered through their work or another voluntary organisation but this does not apply to voluntary work within the church. In this case an existing member form would have to be completed.

## ***Safeguarding Training***

Before working with either children or vulnerable adults, the Church of Scotland have made it mandatory that safeguarding training is undertaken. In our case this is provided by West Lothian Presbytery and I receive information about when and where these take place. They are very often in the evening but some take place on a Saturday morning and usually last for about two and a half hours. Safeguarding training is separate from PVG registration and before working with children or vulnerable adults both PVG registration and Safeguarding training must have taken place.

# View from the Pew



In Chinese philosophy, 'yin and yang' describe how seemingly opposite or contrary forces may be complementary, interconnected, and interdependent in the natural world. As we settle into our period of vacancy, we are enjoying a sort of *yin and yang* effect with our locum minister and our assistant minister alternating our Sunday services.

Brenda paints beautiful word pictures and creates wonderful images. Who will forget the Warrior Bride with her white wedding dress lifted to expose her 'tackety boots'? We know that 'the Church is the Bride of Christ'; **and** we know we are to put on the armour of God and fight the good fight (with all our might). But which of us had thought of reconciling these two very different images into one bride in combat boots?

*(Although a wee trawl through the internet reveals there is currently a fashion for this incongruous outfit. It does get over the wedding-day problem of cripplingly sore feet, standing in killer heels for hours on end!)*

Then there were her unforgettable images of heaven, the very antithesis of the usual jokey picture of sitting around on a fluffy cloud for eternity, strumming a harp, bored out of our minds. Brenda's heaven sounds amazing, fascinating and fulfilling. Her story of the long-distance swimmer, who gave up when almost at the far shore because he could not see it for the fog, was a modern-day parable of our efforts to reach out to heaven and how we give up because we cannot see it or know how near it is. We live in a fog of doubt, often suffering our faith to be ridiculed, eroded and argued away. If we can dispel that fog, we will see the shore that is heaven.

It is closer than we think. She encouraged us to seek the 'thin places' where the veil between our whispering voice and God's listening ear is very thin, where we can see through the fog.

Kenneth is the yang to Brenda's yin: he is a man of science with a meteorology background. His metaphors come from the world of physics and other scientific disciplines. He likened our relationship with heaven to two prisoners awaiting the morning when one will be executed and one will be released. They are in different space-and-time continuums: the first one sees his life coming soon to its end; the second sees his life stretching into the future. Two different realities.

We are probably surrounded for a lot of the time by people who are mentally and spiritually in the place of the condemned prisoner, expecting their lives to come to an end when they die. But we are not in that continuum: we are with the prisoner who expects his release and looks forward to his future. We know that we have eternal life and that it has *already begun* for us with our earthly lives. Death will be simply our gateway from the prologue (our lives now) into the main story (our eternal life in heaven).

Such inspiring and encouraging messages from both our preachers, told in such different ways.

## ANNUAL REPORT 26<sup>th</sup> MAY 2017

The session began with a total of 21 Boys (we are pleased to advise this increased to 24 during the session) and we held our Annual Enrolment Service on Sunday 25<sup>th</sup> September in East Calder Church.

A Service of Thanksgiving was held to celebrate the 50<sup>th</sup> anniversary of West Lothian Battalion of The Boys' Brigade in St Michael's Church, Linlithgow on 18<sup>th</sup> September. A good number of members from 50 years ago up to present day attended and it was a great opportunity for a catch-up.

During October the Company Section Boys paid a visit to Livingston Police Station as part of their Community Badge.

A few of us attended The Battalion Founder's Day Service which was held in Uphall on 2<sup>nd</sup> October this session.

In November 1<sup>st</sup> East Calder organised a Samba Band Workshop and Craft Morning on behalf of the Battalion for Anchor Boys and Junior Section. It was a great morning of music followed by making masks, drums and various other bits and pieces.

During December three of our young men completed a further step towards their President's badges by attending a Building Your Skills Course in Edinburgh.

Once again we had a Christmas Card Delivery Service which raised £270 towards our annual camp. Over 1,000 cards delivered – even those with no addresses!

January was our Burns' Supper and Quiz attended by over 80 people. The Boys worked very hard this year making all the speeches and toasts, serving the meals and presenting the trophy which was won by "1<sup>st</sup> Degree Burns". Well done to all of them! We made a profit of £230 which also went towards Camp expenses.

In February three of our Boys headed off to BBHQ at Carronvale for the Battalion Activities Weekend with a number of Boys from Companies throughout West Lothian. The programme included worship, sports, indoor and outdoor activities, computer games not forgetting catching up with Boys from other Companies. This year one of our senior Boys went along as a staff helper.

March was a busy month, the Anchor Boys celebrated the Battalion's 50<sup>th</sup> anniversary with a party at Yo-Yo Soft Play in Bathgate. Fun, ice cream and cake what more could you ask for?

The Junior Section took part in the Battalion Figure Marching competition and did us proud followed a couple of weeks later with the Spiritual Competition based on the parable of The Lost Sheep once again they did very well.

We participated in the Church Spring Fair and this year we raised £106 to support The Boys' Brigade World Mission Climate Conscious Total Village Project in Bangladesh.

After the Easter break it was time for our Annual Camp and on 28<sup>th</sup> April 17 Boys and 4 Leaders headed off to Canty Bay, which has become a favourite spot with the Boys, for a fun-filled weekend. No doubt the leaders will be discussing next year's camp during the summer break.

On 12<sup>th</sup> May the Battalion May Service and Presentation of Junior Section Gold Award Certificates was held in Armadale Parish Church. Four of our Boys gained their Gold Award this year – these Boys will move up to the Company Section next session.

This year we are delighted to present three young men with their President's Badges. They have now achieved the second highest award in The Boys' Brigade and we congratulate them and wish them well in their work towards their Queen's Badges during the next two years.

Well done to all the Boys on receiving the badges they have worked for throughout the session.



Any surplus from the Tea Tent at the East Calder gala will go to the West Lothian Food Bank (SC008274).


**2) Organisations and Outreach.** Session agreed or noted the following.
