A Touching Place

By the time you read this I suspect Ash Wednesday will have passed and we will be well into the season of Lent, preparing for and anticipating another Easter.

The early Christians didn't celebrate Lent as such. Lent was introduced after the Council of Nicaea in 325AD as a Christian holy day of prayer and fasting marking the six weeks up to Good Friday.



Many churches celebrated Ash Wednesday by marking the sign of the cross on the forehead as a sign of

people's repentance and acceptance of Jesus Christ as Saviour and Lord. The ash was made from the burnt remains of the previous year's palm crosses used on Palm Sunday. The words, 'from dust you came and to dust you will return; repent and believe the Good News' were often used when the sign of the cross was made on the forehead.

The Presbyterian church hasn't always embraced such rituals but there can be something deeply meaningful in small acts of human touch.

Jesus wasn't slow to use touch in his life ministry. Remember how often in the Bible we read that Jesus stretched out his hand to heal, to lift up, to anoint, to open blind eyes, to unstop deaf ears or to simply encourage. And there was the time when, with many people crowding round him, he was able to feel the touch of a bleeding woman and stop and make time for her and heal her and commend her faith. One touch from the King changed everything.

The Gospel of Matthew tells us that when Jesus arrived in a certain place, the "people brought all their sick to him and begged him to let the sick just touch the edge of his cloak, and all who touched it were healed" (Matthew 14:35-6).

Jesus came to be the touching place of life and love in a world often starved of such a touch. This cost him his life. In obedience he let it go. He laid it down and God raised him to new life. The touch of Christ is now ours to receive and ours to give.

In our coming and in our going, may we stumble upon the touching places of Christ. In our ministry together, may we create Christ filled touching places.

Christ's is the world in which we move. Christ's are the folk we're summoned to love, Christ's is the voice which calls us to care, and Christ is the One who meets us here.

To the lost Christ shows His face; to the unloved He gives His embrace; to those who cry in pain or disgrace, Christ, makes, with His friends, a touching place. (John L. Bell)

Extract from Session Minutes of 26th November 2019 and 28th January 2020

Safeguarding

Churches are now required to ask all new workers who have <u>access</u> to children and/or protected adults to apply for a Basic Disclosure check from Disclosure Scotland. This applies to new post holders only.

The Government has determined that the PVG Certificate will no longer be part of a lifetime membership scheme. This will mean that voluntary (and paid) workers doing regulated work in the Church, will be required to renew/update their Certificate every 5 years. We are awaiting further guidance around the implementation of this change in practice.

A reminder that safeguarding training (in addition to a PVG Certificate) is mandatory for all who are working with children and/or protected adults.

Listening Project

A Feasibility Study funded by Go for It was undertaken last year and the decision taken to run a Pilot having applied for funding again from Go for It. The Pilot will employ 1 part-time person and will have 2 to 3 fully trained listeners. There is a Management Group comprising at present only two people. The Group would like more people with management skills to join. Applications should be addressed to the Moderator. The Partnership Centre is to be used as opposed to the Church. A General Listening Skills course has been arranged for 4th April and is open to anybody to attend. To be an accredited listener on the Pilot one must attend a further 2 day course and join the PVG Scheme. Mid Calder Church has been invited to join us on this project.

Community Social Enterprise (Reuse and Thrive)

We are awaiting a decision on the charitable status. Policies and job descriptions have been drawn up. Need now to sign people up to participate which the team will try to do. There may be a further slight delay due to the premises planned to be used suffering some water ingress.
