By the time you read this I will have started as your new minister and hopefully will not have made too many gaffes! Not that I make a habit of making gaffes but I recognise that it's part of our human condition to have weaknesses as well as strengths. I'm looking



forward to getting to know people well and I believe that one of the best ways to get to know one another well is to share our stories and to bring them into the light of God's great story of his love for us. That's why I'd like to make time to meet, one to one, with as many of the congregation as would like to, in the weeks and months ahead, so we can share our stories and hopefully you will allow me to pray with you as we do. Everyone has a story and everyone's story matters. I can't wait to hear yours as we begin (and continue) the grace-filled ministry of Christ together.

Do not be anxious about anything, but in every situation, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, present your requests to God. And the peace of God, which transcends all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus. (Philippians 4:6-7)

I believe prayer really does make a difference. When Sarah and I went to Stirling, we wanted to begin ministry there with forty days of prayer during which we held small prayer gatherings each morning and evening and encouraged everyone to be prayerful during that period. God spoke clearly to us about one or two things we should begin with.

Please consider coming along to an informal evening worship on Sundays at 6.30 pm in East Calder Church Hall to meet in fellowship with others.


