From the Manse

"Dear brothers and sisters, you are dearly loved by God and we know that he has chosen you to be his very own. For our gospel came to you not merely in the form of words but in mighty power infused with the Holy Spirit and deep conviction. Surely you remember how we lived our lives transparently before you to encourage you." (1 Thessalonians 1:4-5)



Last week Sarah and I had the privilege of having a holiday in Greece. We flew to Thessaloniki and spent the week on the Kassandra Peninsula, the area called Halkidiki. Thessaloniki is a huge city of over one million people. In New Testament times, Thessalonica was the major sea port in the area and so it was an important place for the apostle Paul, Timothy and Silas, to visit with the good news of the gospel.

It is obvious that the whole region has deep Christian roots and the Greek Orthodox Church clearly continues to thrive. I loved how so many homes have little model Byzantine structures in their gardens which have candles in them. They are often dedicated to famous saints. The most famous saint in that region was Saint Demetrius and the oldest church building in Thessaloniki is the 5th century Church of Saint Demetrius.

While I was there I read Paul's letters to the Thessalonians and was struck by these verses at the start of the first letter about how important it is to live out one's faith in practical ways.

N.T.Wright says in his commentary, "Christian behaviour is not a matter of a few rules made up by a heavenly bureaucrat or policeman but a matter of reflecting God's glory with every part of life". He goes on to quote the old poem,

I'd rather see a sermon, than hear one any day; I'd rather one would walk with me than merely show the way. The eye's a better pupil, more willing than the ear; Fine counsel is confusing, but example's always clear. Demetrius, Paul, Silas and Timothy all demonstrated their faith in Christ, not just with words but by the way they lived transparently and trusting in the power of God's Spirit to be with them and to guide them. The same Spirit is here with us, inspiring us to reflect the glory of God with every part of life.

Father God in Jesus name we thank you for all the praying people in this place and all the times and places we stop to thank you and ask your guidance and blessings.


