

Dear Congregation

I am really sad to say that this will officially be my last letter to you as the minister of Kirknewton and East Calder Parish. I have enjoyed my time in this Parish and will go away knowing that I am a better person through knowing you. You have accepted me and my family and you have opened your hearts to us. Your homes were always a safe place for us to anchor whenever we needed a wee bit of TLC. We will never forget all the kindness and love shown to us. Kirknewton and East Calder Parish will always have a special place in my heart. In many ways you have enriched my journey in Scotland. For this I will remain forever grateful. I hope and pray that my legacy will live on long after I have left. My legacy to you will be to continue to break down all the barriers that exist between the established church and the community, and all the walls between people of faith and people who do not have any faith at all. There is a big difference between faith and religion and as followers of Jesus we practice faith and not religion.

I want to leave you with the passage in Philippians 4:4-9:

"Rejoice in the Lord always. I will say it again: Rejoice! <sup>5</sup> Let your gentleness be evident to all. The Lord is near. <sup>6</sup> Do not be anxious about anything, but in every situation, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, present your requests to God. <sup>7</sup> And the peace of God, which transcends all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus. <sup>8</sup> Finally, brothers and sisters, whatever is true, whatever is noble, whatever is right, whatever is pure, whatever is lovely, whatever is admirable—if anything is excellent or praiseworthy—think about such things.<sup>9</sup> Whatever you have learned or received or heard from me, or seen in me—put it into practice. And the God of peace will be with you."

As mentioned in the last issue of KNEC News, West Lothian Presbytery's 'Simply Church' event was held on 27<sup>th</sup> August.



After worrying about the weather we were blessed with a lovely day, a picturesque location and an excellent response from the Churches and the congregations in West Lothian.

The purpose of Simply Church was to get churches together and to display the work that is done in West Lothian by the Churches and other groups associated with them.

There was a happy atmosphere and there was always a buzz (sometimes wasps) but on the whole the buzz was from the people. There was an avenue of 28 marquees leading to the main marquee where the band played during the afternoon and led the songs of praise. The main marquee being open at the sides meant that you could look down the avenue and through the main marquee and see Linlithgow Loch at the other side. Lovely sight.

It was interesting to see the number of different ideas and presentations.

Our display was based on OUR HISTORY, OUR VISION, OUR GROUPS & OUTREACH.

We also had flower arrangements (they were well admired) depicting three important dates in the Church Calendar:



**Christmas** with a reading from Isaiah 9 v6 and v7

**Easter** based on 1 Corinthians 15 v3 - v8

The fourth arrangement illustrated 'Our Vision' and the 1<sup>st</sup> and 4th verses of MP 511 'Be thou my vision'. The arrangement included three lilies representing the three distinct priorities in our Vision - Our Parish, Our Congregation and Our Young People.

Posters, leaflets and photographs illustrating our History, Vision and Groups/Outreach were included on the Display Stand.

The display was replicated in Church on Sunday, 28<sup>th</sup> and formed part of the service the theme of which was 'Show and Tell'.

### **DR GROENEWALD'S INDUCTION AT BALERNO**

Dr Groenewald's Induction to Balerno Parish Church takes place on Tuesday 25 October at 7.00pm. Everyone is welcome to attend this service



By the time this magazine comes out, we will be one week away from being a 'vacant charge'. An odd expression which conjures up a picture of either a dull-witted dependant or a riderless warhorse!

Hopefully, KNEC sans minister will be neither of those.

For sure, we are not dull-witted. Our two congregations comprise: the wise and experienced; the willing and competent; the well-educated and articulate; and the kind and caring.

We have had our outgoing minister for seven years and inevitably have depended upon his energetic leadership and have shaped our fellowship to fit his distinctive style. Now, we have to shake off dependence and rise up to the challenge of steering our own ship.

We will be 'riderless' in one sense, not directed by one person in authority, but we need not be directionless, simply stumbling through the next year or so in a fog, like what my old granny used to call 'a knotless thread'. We can use the time to discover or *un*-cover skills of planning, creating and achieving that may not get such an outlet when there is an appointed leader. Have you seen the film 'Warhorse'? The star of the show, a simple farm-bred horse, rises to the challenges thrown at him. He is not given a choice. He has to endure four years of relentless hardship, brutal forced-labour and life-threatening danger. By the end of the Great War, he is barely recognisable as the fine animal he once was. He is broken and defeated, all his noble spirit gone ...

Until he hears a faint whistle, a tune he recognises from long-ago, happier days, a tune he associates with a beloved master. And his ears prick up, his head lifts, his emaciated, wounded body straightens itself, his exhausted legs find a last surge of energy. He has been found by his master and all his love and loyalty comes flooding back. Not a dry eye in the house, of course. Who doesn't love a happy ending?

The next year for us, in our vacant, riderless state, will not put us through anything like four years in the Great War. It will require endurance, loyalty, hard work, stamina and commitment but, unlike that unfortunate, exploited animal, we will not be separated from our beloved master at any time, bereft of hope. Our Lord and Master will be with us every step of the way.

Farewell, André, go with our thanks and our blessing. We hope you will pray for this old warhorse you are leaving behind, as we will pray for you and your lovely family in your new, no-longer-vacant 'charge'.
